Organizational & Financial Updates By Scott Manke

What an exciting time of year as we get back into a fall schedule, children are back in school, and the seasons begin to change once again. As you know by now we have been busily expanding some of our programs and activities at the Center and had a very active summer of sports camps, community events, and hosting of Envision teams. While all that was happening, we have been active internally as well, putting into place better procedures and practices, further solidifying our organizational structure so that we can better serve the community.

We just completed the requirements of a Grant we received through YSCEP (Youth Services Capacity Enhancement Program) and in our final interview we were told that we had done a fabulous job in managing the activity funds received from the grant. We were also told that we would be considered in the future for further grants should they become available and that we can count on a solid referral from them in the future.

We have also been looking at our financial practices. At our May Board of Directors meeting, we made the decision to become ECFA accredited. ECFA stands for Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability. They provide accreditation to leading Christian nonprofit organizations that faithfully demonstrate compliance with established standards for financial accountability, fundraising and board governance. This process required a review of our current practices, which were needed to be in alignment with their criteria. Thank God we were already in line with most of the criteria. It also required a review of our financial activity by an independent accountant or accounting firm. We are about 90% of the way through the process and hope to announce our accreditation with them by years end.


