Since resuming our After School progam in February, families have been enjoying the chance to get thier kids into this amazing program.

One parent stated her son has so much fun being with the other kids "The program is the only place that he has been able to do this because of remote learning."

Our goal for the program this year is to provide a safe place for kids to connect with others, develop their creativity, and have fun in recreational sports.





This year we have decided to start something new in our After School Program. We have started a new photoshop class, that teaches our students how to edit and even create pictures. Heading this amazing new class is one of our work study students, Jaileen. She is an Advertising and Marketing major at Loyola University in Chicago. The Director of the Say Yes Program, Dylan Adams, stated "It's great to see our kids have fun in a new and creative setting. They absolutely miss the social interaction with others. God made us to me creative and relational beings; kids need this now more then ever."

As part of our tutoring, mentorship and youth development focus, we offer the S.A.Y. Yes! After School Program: an initiative designed to meet the unique needs of at-risk urban youth. S.A.Y. Yes! provides a platform to address the systemic barriers found within the urban educational system by equipping children with the academic, interpersonal, and character skills necessary to succeed in education and life. Through the S.A.Y. Yes! program, we serve 35-40 students a semester.



SPANISH SPEAKING MINISTRY

To God's praise our Spanish Speaking ministry has been on a consistent rhythm for over 16 months and seeing 10 participants joining in on a mid-week virtual gathering. This Bible Study group has also engaged families from our after school program children. In particular, we are excited that both husband and wife are joining in this weekly gathering. We are praying for the equipping and transformation of entire families, and are thrilled that this family is seeking after Christ as a couple. The impact of the entire family is evident when

Christ does the transforming work. And we've seen that the after school program is a place where God reaches the children but also the parents/guardians of these children. For example, through the after school program, a mom in the community came to know personally about Christ. This mom has been engaged with FEC in the Sunday Worship for over 5 years and in her journey of faith – the church family has been able to disciple her into a path of growth.

By God's grace and power, this single mom, was rescued from a world of abuse and exploitation.

This transformed and redeemed child of Godcourageously shared her faith testimony with the entire church during a recent Sunday worship service. We praise God for his redeeming work in the life of this mom and are excited to hear how the Lord is using her as she boldly shares the gospel in her workplace and with her family.

FOOD PANTRY

Over the years we have partnered with various organizations to provide food for families in need within our community. These activities have included distributing upwards of 200 baskets of food whereby they are able to enjoy a nice holiday meal for Thanksgiving. We also have partnered with the Hunger Resource Network to provide over 4000 lbs of frozen chicken to similar families of need within our community twice a year. We also regularly feed children within our programs and offer meals to those who are homeless on a day to day, case by case basis.

Since the outbreak of Covid-19, we have found many more families in need of food resources and have moved this service of providing food for families in need to a twice a month food distribution, have had an increase in demand for food assistance, and have since been developing more partnerships for food resources that we then pass along within our community.

Rachel Madella, director of the Food Bank stated "Serving our community through our pantry is allowing us to be present with families that we already have relationship with and develop new ones. It's amazing how we continue to have 15-20 new families visit us each pantry day and we serve about 90 familes at each distribution."

In an ongoing effort to reach and equip those from other nations in our community, Family Empowerment Centers offers an English as a Second Language (ESL) class.

Our ESL classes are taught entirely in English. Grammar and vocabulary lessons are taught through listening, speaking, reading, and writing exercises. Lessons also include fun activities like games and practical activities that teach students how to use English in their daily life. Our teachers attempt to create a safe learning environment so each student can comfortably participate in the learning process. There are three available class levels offered: beginner, intermediate, and advanced. Placement tests are given to determine the best class level for each student. There are also several conversation nights offered throughout the year, which is a time for students to play games, get to know each other, and practice the English they have been learning in a comfortable environment.

Classes meet twice a week on Tuesday and Thursday evenings during the school year. Classes begin at 6:30pm and end at 8:30pm, with a 10 minute break at 7:30 to enjoy snacks, coffee, and build relationships with others in the program.

We ask that students arrive to class on time, as teachers will begin their class promptly at 6:30.
