# S.A.Y Yes After School Program Going 5 Days a Week!

Over the past 5 years we have been modifying and expanding our after school program with a goal of operating 5 days a week. We started out with a 2 day a week program and ran that way for the first 3 years of operations. Last year we expanded the program to a 3 day a week program and hired a new Director for the program, Malvin Pambuka. This summer we have been working at expanding our computer lab and developing a better system of measuring success, and a more wholistic program that includes service projects.

This fall we are moving to a 5 day a week program that will bring all this preparation together into what we believe will be an exceptional after school

program that will give the children a great opportunity to grow as whole people. In order to make this happen it will require identifying 3 part-time staff and raising an additional \$2,500 per month. We are researching options to raise money through grant writing and programs for low-income families to have their tuition cost subsidized through various governmental programs, but, we know that it will take time for these options to become fruitful.



# Letter From Our S.A.Y. Yes Director—Malvin Pambuka

We are excited about the new avenues this S.A.Y. Yes season will bring. If I were to summarize the upcoming school year in one word, that word would be **GROWTH.** As the After School Program's director, I realize that I too will have to apply myself to the season of growth.

This years theme — **Growth**, refers to an increase in some quantity over time. The quantity can be physical (i.e., growth in height, growth in an amount of money), abstract (i.e., a system becoming more complex, an organism becoming more mature), or the mode of growth, i.e. numeric models for describing how much a particular quantity grows over time.

Our expansion, new measurement tools and educational software, and our modernized computer lab will surely encourage growth.

You will be hearing more about how to partner financially with this growth in the weeks to come, but for now we are asking people who believe in the education of children, creating growth opportunities for underprivileged children, and the greater work of the Family Empowerment Center to pray for this expansion.
