

10 Youth Attend Chicago Alive Youth Camp - by Brandie



I arrived in Chicago to begin working with Family Empowerment Centers less than one week prior to Chicago Alive Youth Camp (CAY Camp). My first assignment: attend a four-day sleep-away camp designed to offer urban youth, ages 9-18, a chance to step outside their context for a few days, learn about God, and escape the pressures associated with urban living. This year the Center enrolled 10 youth and 4 adult counselors in CAY Camp. My time as a counselor was one I will never forget! God provided countless opportunities for connections to be made and relationships to be built with the campers in my group. Whether we were playing games, eating a meal together, struggling through the ropes course, going down the river in a canoe (and then getting tipped out!), or having deep conversations after our worship service, each activity was used to invest in these teenagers, and pour out love, kindness, and acceptance upon them. As they began opening up, many shared of coming from broken

homes in which they deal with depression, loneliness, anger, identity issues, and in extreme cases, thoughts of suicide. It brought joy to me to see them smiling, laughing, making friendships, singing songs of worship to God, and drawing closer to God. I truly believe that God changed many lives over the four days of camp, and I pray that the truth they heard, the friendships they made, and the love they felt will stay with them as they go back to their routine of daily life.



Emergency Response Training Open to the Community

During the week of August 19-23, the International Fellowship of Chaplains will host a 45-hour training in Chicago at Family Empowerment Centers. Participants can enroll for personal or professional betterment or certification/ credentials. Training sessions include: crisis response, domestic violence response, suicidology, stress management, among others. This training is perfect for law enforcement officials, first responders, or church lay leaders/pastoral staff, or anyone serving in a community care role.

Brenda Kulowiyi, a member of Family Empowerment Centers' church, completed the Chaplaincy training program in 2012, earning a certificate. Brenda shares her thoughts about IFOC's training: "I highly recommend this training. I wish I had the opportunity to take this class earlier in my life. If so, I would have been able to identify symptoms of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, which I experienced as a child. This course would have helped me identify negative influences in my life and seek out resources to support me. This class also helped me in my parenting role to my son as I learned that brain functionality is different in men and women, in terms of how we process information differently. This enabled me to adapt my communication style with my son."
