So when the children who participate say in the Life Skills section of our program, "God loves me" and it is apparent that they really know that truth and mean it, it satisfies us to know that they are getting holistically

Carol, a loving senior who will not slow down, continues to follow the path God has laid out for her and reach out to help anyway she is able. Our Expanding Faith Community

One of our desires has been to care for the whole person. Ones spiritual care is very important to us and over the years we have met on Saturday evenings and now Sunday mornings as a faith community to worship God. Her desire is to be a door greeter, helper in Sunday school classes for the children, and help with our coffee station set up. As she expressed this desire she did so with great joy on her face that she could be more involved in giving of her time as she took that step of faith.





English as a Second Language

In an ongoing effort to reach and equip those from other nations in our community, Family Empowerment Centers continues to offer English as a Second Language classes. Through partnership with students from Moody Bible Institute's TESOL program, we are able to offer quality class environments.

Students enrolled in ESL classes come from all over the world including: Mexico, Guatemala, Burma, Egypt, Hon-

duras, Pakistan, Ethiopia, Bolivia and more. With these classes, our students are continuously improving his/her English. Parents have expressed that they are fluent enough to get jobs, help their children with homework, and better communicate with strangers on a daily basis. As a result these students have a drive and motivation to be able to participate in ESL classes.

Men's Growth & Expansion

With such a diverse group of men that come through the Center we have found that our Men's Bible study is a great tool to bring our multi-ethnic, multi-generational, and economically diverse group together around something they all have in common; a desire to know God better and be known. These men have been exploring through the New Testament for the last few months. Most recently we have spent time in Revelation, celebrating the victory of Jesus Christ. As a group, we look forward to God's future kingdom and his final success over evil. Our



group is pushing toward this expectation by challenging one another to live with holiness and honesty as we grow in confidence and strength. The FEC Men's group is expanding to include community meetings on both Wednesday and Saturday, as well as upcoming service projects and community days.
