The noises of fifty people enjoying a meal together ricocheted throughout the building on Family Friday, as laughter and conversation flourished. As Kristen (my wife) came upstairs to begin preparing for the next activity, she was surprised to find Leticia sitting alone. They immediately struck up conversation, and Leticia began to share about a recent divorce and the painful way it has left her feeling lonely. She talked about her desire to raise her children well, and her uncertainty about how to ensure they stay on track. As they worked together to clean up and put out the supplies for the next activity, Leticia and Kristen began to build a friendship. By the end of the evening, Kristen and I had made plans to spend time with Leticia. In this small moment, we were thrilled to live out the mission of Family Empowerment Centers: to glorify God and to love our neighbor, Leticia, by helping to strengthen her family. In recent days, we have been thrilled to care for many of our neighbors through English classes, Family Friday events, and other programs, but our favorite moments are the ones in which we get to connect individually with our neighbors and care for them personally. This Year By The Numbers





This year so far the Family Empowerment Centers...

- Hosted 301 Envision Mission participants in 2023
- Ran 4 weeks of soccer camp with a weekly attendance over 30
- Ran 6 weeks of day camp with a weekly attendance of over 40 in Rogers Park
- · Ran 4 weeks of day camp in Albany Park with

- over 15 children registered
- Hosted a smalll group in Albany Park over the summer and again in the fall with 10 people working at developing a core team
- Operated ESL classes in Albany Park along with the migrant ministry one night a week
- Hosted a Family Night once a month in Albany Park with more than 50 people attending the first one.
- Served more than 5000 New Neighbors (migrants) since March (this number is the total of peoples served each day rather than number of unique people)
- Served breakfast 86 times this year to migrants and served dinner 36 times this year

- Received the equivalent of 4+ box trucks of clothing, strollers, bicycles, luggage and other items through community donors who come in daily with bags of clothing and send new clothing through Amazon purchases
- Offered our New Neighbors 2 weekly ESL classes, a Bible study, and classes on family and trauma concerns (communication, domestic violence, parenting, etc...)
- Had 50 children and counselors participate in our Chicago Alive Youth Camp in June for 9-14 year olds
- Had 50 children and counselors participate in our High School Chicago Alive Youth Camp
- Had approximately 25 Sullivan HS football players and their coaches to our Full Camp
- Served nearly 60 families a week through the food pantry
- Cared for and mentored more than 20 registered children each day during the After School Program

Your Help Goes A Long Way

These are just some examples of how your support can help us care for those in our community.

\$90
a day feeds 50 new neighbors.

\$104
provides 12 men or women 2 pairs each of fresh underwear.

\$180

a day provides the staff to operate the migrant care.

\$220

a week provides the funding for 3 ESL Classes.

\$450

a month provides one child the opportunity to participate in the After School Program.

\$1,200

a week allows us to operate our food pantry at full capacity and feed over 50 families a week. In essence, for as little as \$25 we provide families over \$75 of food resources. General giving towards the Center will be used where it is most needed.

When activities increase so do the costs associated with the programs and activities we provide. In the past 6 months we have stepped into the humanitarian crisis in Chicago with migrant work which to run effectively is a \$5000 a month minimal commitment. Our activities at our second location in Albany Park are significantly ramping up and of course our regular programming is still active and thriving in an economy where prices are skyrocketing.
